Justification – God's declaration that we are not guilty for our sin. It is Christ's sacrificial death that makes divine forgiveness possible. It is through Christ that people are empowered by the Holy Spirit to live in a way that pleases God.

Mercy – God withholding not giving us what we deserve.

Propitiation – Covering sacrificial death that makes divine forgiveness possible.

Repentance – Giving entire disposition to the mind by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Sanctification - Process of becoming like Him.

Sanctify – "Set apart"; separate for holiness; set apart for service (not only kept from evil, but that they may advance in holiness). John 17:15-19

The Bible is the central religious text of Judaism and Christianity. The Old Testament tells the story of the Nation of Israel. It contains 39 books from Genesis to Malachi. The Old Testament is $\frac{3}{4}$ of the Bible. The events of the Old Testament are before the life of Christ. The New Testament tells the story of Christ. It contains 27 books from Matthew to Revelation. It is $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Bible and details the life and ministry of Christ. The events of the New Testament are during and after the life of Christ and chronicles the growth of the early church.
