The Old Testament is $\frac{3}{4}$ of the Bible. The events of the Old Testament are before the life of Christ. The New Testament tells the story of Christ. It contains 27 books from Matthew to Revelation. It is $\frac{1}{4}$ th of the Bible and details the life and ministry of Christ. The events of the New Testament are during and after the life of Christ and chronicles the growth of the early church.
